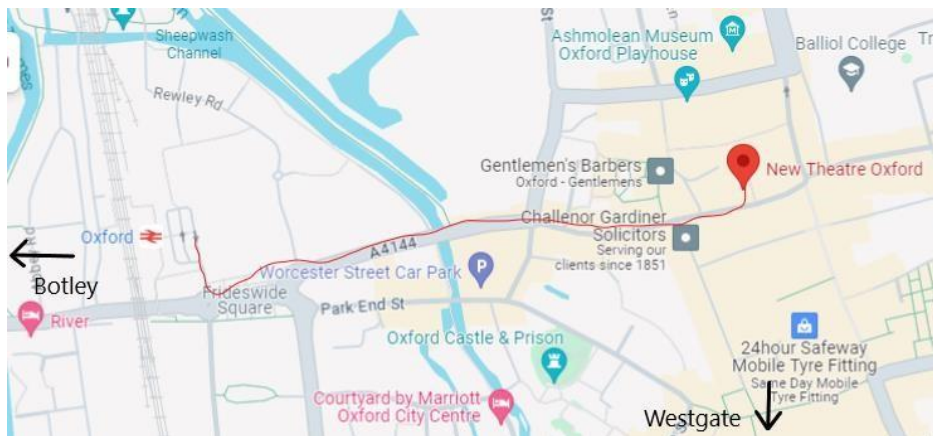


The New Theatre Oxford

The New Theatre Oxford is the main commercial theatre in Oxford and has a capacity of nearly 1,800 people. There has been a theatre on the corner of George Street for almost 170 years. The first theatre built in 1836 was known commonly as the 'Vic', and later as the 'Theatre Royale' and has previously been the home of Oxford University Dramatic Society. The theatre was damaged by fire in 1892 and enlarged in 1908, and the present building dates from 1933, opening in 1934.

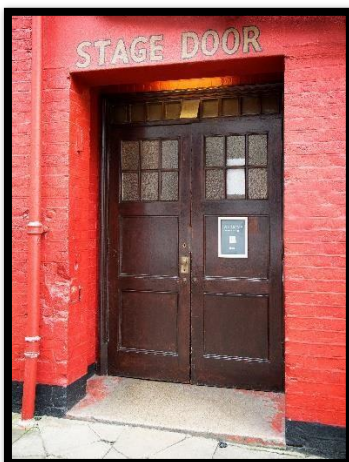


Our venue host touring productions ranging from musicals, comedians, music events and we host private conferences. We have a 3-tiered auditorium and 5 bars throughout the foyers, backstage we have 9 dressing rooms and 2 band rooms across 6 floors.



Our venue is located in the centre of the city, it is around a 10-minute walk to the train station and is in walking distance of 4 car parks. We always recommend the park and rides when coming into Oxford as the parking is much cheaper and the buses stop within a 5 minute or less walk from the venue.

To access the building please come to the stagedoor which is located at the back of the theatre opposite the red lion pub, here our lovely stagedoor keeper will greet you and let you in.
