

## The Princess Theatre

The Princess Theatre is South Devon's largest regional theatre with a capacity of nearly 1,500 patrons. The Theatre first opened its doors on Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> June 1963, with Tommy Cooper and Morecambe & Wise. We have always attracted first class companies and famous names including The Beatles, Sir Roger Moore, Joan Rivers, Billy Ocean, Paloma Faith as well as comedians Al Murray, Jimmy Carr, Russell Howard and Katherine Ryan. We showcase the best West End and touring productions from across the UK and a wide variety of performances, including top-named comedians, musicals, local productions, one-night concerts, ballet, opera and our annual pantomime. We also have our Teatro café and Ice cream hatch that are open seasonally during the day as well as a restaurant for pre-theatre dining overlooking the beautiful Bay. Managed by ATG the venue is due to start a significant refurbishment project in Summer 2024 to upgrade the auditorium seats and improve the Front of House spaces and Dressing Rooms.

### How to get to The Princess Theatre

#### Trains /Buses

Torquay train station is served by GWR and CrossCountry with frequent services running towards Exeter St David's and the South West. Located on the seafront, a 15 minute walk or 5 minute taxi journey from the theatre. Bus stops are located on Torbay Road, approximately 3 minutes walk from the theatre served all day by the number 12. For more information on bus times please check the Stagecoach app or website.

#### Parking

The closest car parks are Fleet Walk (TQ2 5DZ) or Sheddon Hill (TQ2 5TY). There is limited parking available on Torbay Road outside the theatre.
